sand acres thereof in ye County of Chester These are therefore  
in ye Proprietarys name<sup>to</sup> will and Require thee fforthwith to Survey  
or Cause to be Surveyd unto him ye said Number of Acres in ye  
aforesaid County where not already taken up according to the  
Method of Townships appoynted by ye Gover<sup>r</sup> he seating and  
improving the same within Six months after ye Date of  
Survey and make Returne hereof to ye secretarys Office.
