

Whereas the Proprietor by his Letter bearing Date the 21st day of the first Month A.D. 1700, directed to Henry Hollingsworth then Surveyor of Chester County ordered him the said surveyor to lay out unto John Symcock of the said County Since Deceased the quantity of two thousand eight hundred and seventy five acres purchased of the Proprietor by ~~Howe & John~~ Said John Symcock by Deeds of Lease ~~and Lease~~ and Release bearing Date the 3^d and 4th days of May A.D. 1682 which Pursuant to the Directions Given in the said Letter the said Surveyor Accordingly laid out in One Tract Called Hilltown in the said County which Tract has from the time of the said Survey been in the Possession of the said John Symcock and his Heirs or Assigns but hath never yet been Returned accord- to the Established Regulation Nor past the Offices for Supplying of which Defect The Commiss^{rs} of Property by their Warrant dated the 4th day of November A.D. 1713 have authorized and Required me to take the Said Survey into ^{my} Office and to Return the same into the Secretaries Office Now this may Certifie that in pursuance of the said Warrant I have Received the Surveye and Draught of the said two thousand eight hundred and seventy five acres of Land which was surveyd the 19th of the 2^d Month 1701 Beginning at a White oak marked at a Corner of the Mannor of Springtown Thence by a Line of the said Mannor South four hundred perches to a black Oak Thence East by another Line of the said Mannor thirty Nine pches
