 ly by word or warrant to thee <sup>was</sup> ordered James Boyden to take  
 up nine hundred and seventy Akers up nesheminahs Creeke  
 and that he shoulde have in parte thereof what that Land  
 held out Betweene Samuell Allen and John Swarte And y<sup>e</sup>  
 Rest Above John Swarte, But not the very next Above to John  
Swarte: Because y<sup>e</sup> Reserved six hundred and seventy Akers for  
 my selfe and John Spencer, <sup>therefore I hereby require thee to Lay out for mee and</sup> the saide six hundred and seven-  
 ty Akers And next Lay out to James Boyden his Remainder of his  
 nine hundred and seventy Akers: And then next lay out to George  
 White fifteene hundred Akers: and next lay out to Richard  
 Amon two hundred forty five Akers: and next Lay out to  
 William Carter four hundred and ninety Akers: observinge  
 the rule of twenty pole to A hundred Akers by the Creeke  
 side And to Returne unto mee A true duplicate of y<sup>e</sup> field  
 worke and protracted figure which are to Remaine in my
