

Pennsylvania

By vertue of a wart from the propietr and Govern<sup>t</sup> dated this day, to survey one hundred acres for James paxon, one hundred more for W<sup>m</sup> Packson, one hundred more for peter Tremain, one hundred more for John Flackney, and one hundred more for Thomas Marle & Sarah phillipps, in the County of Bucks, as head rights for them, I therefore hereby empower thee to survey and set out unto the above said persons, the respective quantities of Lands on the back of the purchases at Neshaminkh Creek, where first the back will allow & admitt thereof, and to observe the Method of Townshipps by the Govern<sup>t</sup>, and these head rights are not to run so long as usual, ~~but~~ in former warts from the Creek, but let them be in a resonable long square, about a mile long, each square, And when done to returne unto me a true duplicate of the field work and protracted figures, which are to remain in my office.
