

By Vertue of a Warrant under the hands of the Commiss^{rs} of property and the seal of the Province bearing date the 8 day of y^e 03^d month 1702

Resurveyd the 26th of the 12th month 1702 unto Jn^o Stotcher a tract of land in Middletown in the County of Chester beginning at a white oak by Chester Creek from thence Extending by the line of Thomas Cartwrights land and Thomas Martins land East north east three hundred and sixty perches to a corner post Then by Jn^o Musgrave's land North 24 degr: west ninety two per. to a spanish oak Thence by the Widow Beaks land and Jn^o Bostocks land south sixty six degrees west four hundred and fifty perches to a white oak by the sd Chester Creek then down the said Creek on severall Courses one hundred thirty eight per. to the first mentioned White oak Containing two hundred twenty eight acres Resurvey'd by Isaac Taylor
