Jeremiah Dean having obtained a Warr<sup>t</sup> for 50<sup>as</sup> more or less dated the \_\_\_ day of \_\_\_ Anno Dom<sup>i</sup> adjoin<sup>t</sup> his own land Hannah Harlan Widow & Administrat<sup>r</sup> of Stephen Harlan dec<sup>d</sup> opposed y<sup>e</sup> Survey the Case being represented to the hon<sup>ble</sup> the proprietor by James Steel setting forth their claim (as the same was stated by Jno Taylor's letter to him) I also having desired the prop<sup>r</sup>s directions in the case he was pleased on the 4<sup>th</sup> of May 1740 that 250<sup>as</sup> & Allow<sup>ance</sup> be laid out the heirs of Stephen Harlan if y<sup>e</sup> derive y<sup>e</sup> claim regularly from George Robinson who obtained a Warr<sup>t</sup> as afores<sup>d</sup> & that y<sup>e</sup> Rem<sup>t</sup> 50<sup>as</sup> & allowance adjoining Jer<sup>m</sup> Dean's other land be laid out to Jerem<sup>h</sup> Dean.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this Seventh day of February 1910
