At the Request of David Robert That we would grant him to take up two hundred Acres of Land between the Branches of Brandywine for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors use within three Months five and twenty Pounds for y<sup>e</sup> whole ~~the~~ <sup>9</sup> ~~the~~ yearly Quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for each Hundred for ever. These are to Authorize and Require thee to <sup>sur</sup>vey or cause to be survey'd to the said David Robert according to the Method of Townships appointed, the said quantity of Two hundred acres of Vacant Land in y<sup>e</sup> sd County & place that has not been already Survey'd nor is appropriated nor Seated by the Indians. And make a Return thereof into the Secretaries Office ~~the~~ Which Survey in case the said David fulfill the said agreem<sup>t</sup> shall be Valid otherwise to be void & of no effect as if it had never been made nor this Warr<sup>t</sup> ever granted, Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> y<sup>e</sup> 27<sup>th</sup> day of Sept<sup>r</sup> A.D. 1716
