Whereas George Palmer Purchaser of five thousand Acres of Land in this Province from the Proprietary did by his Last Will and Testam<sup>t</sup> Devise to his eldest Son George Palmer eight hundred Acres part of the sd Land: and whereas the sd George having been for a long time under a Deplorable Captivity, hath requested us that in Consideration of the great Losses & Disappointm<sup>ts</sup> he hath sustained by his Said State of Misery We would Grant him to take up the sd Land as Commodiously as may be and the most to his Advantage: These therefore are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey and lay out to the Said George Palmer the sd quantity of eight Hundred Acres of Land either in some <sup>Copy of</sup> commodious Place in y<sup>e</sup> Tract commonly called the Great Swamp or elsewhere as it will best suit the sd George's Convenience being not already Survey'd nor taken up nor concealed nor seated by the Indians: And make returns into y<sup>e</sup> General Surveyors office at Philad<sup>ia</sup> where this Warr<sup>t</sup> is to remain & a Copy thereof to be deliv<sup>d</sup> to thee certified by y<sup>e</sup> Secretary, Given under our hands & y<sup>e</sup> Seal of y<sup>e</sup> Province 26<sup>th</sup> of y<sup>e</sup> 11<sup>th</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> 1702
