That I would grant them to take up twelve hundred and fifty Acres of Land in the Welsh Tract in this Province, formerly granted by a Warrant from my Commissioners of Property to the Said Thomas Loyd in right of Margaret Davies Joynt Purchaser with Charles Loyd, but not yet laid out, These are to require thee forthwith to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto them in behalf of the said Thomas Loyd deceased the Said Number of Acres in two or in three parcels as it shall be most convenient in such places of the Said Welsh Tract as have not been yet taken up And make Returns thereof into my Secretaries Office. Given under my hand and Seal ^{at Philad^{ia}} the 13th day of the 10th Month 1700.
