



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Commiss^{rs} of Property for Laying out to Joseph Shippen Jun^r four Hund^d and Eighty Six acres & two thirds of an acres of Land. There was Survey'd to Michael Baughman (who pchased of S^d Joseph Shippen) A Tract of Land situate on a Branch of Swatara in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at a Hickery on the west Side of the s^d Branch, thence South by West by vacant Land 170 pches to a Hickery thence East by ~~the~~ South by Vacant Land 293 pches to another Hickery, thence North by East by Vacant Land 170 pches to a post thence West by North by Vacant Land 293 pches to the Beginning Containing two Hundred & Ninty acres & the allowance of Six p. Cent.
