

Pennsylvania. ss.

By Virtue of a General Warrant Dated the 28th Day of November 1748. I have caused to be Surveyed on the sixth Day of November 1749 for the Use of the Honourable the Proprietaries a Certain Tract of Land situate on the East side of Schuylkill River beyond the Blue Mountains ^{formerly} in the County of Philad^a. now in the County of Berks. Beginning at a marked black oak Sapling standing on the bank of the said River and from thence extending by Vacant Land the eight Courses and Distances next following Viz^d: North thirty seven Degrees East one hundred and thirty Perches to a post. South Seventy two deg^s East one hundred and thirty four perches to a marked Spanish oak. North sixty eight Degrees East one hundred and fourteen Perches to a small Hickery marked. East forty four perches to a marked white oak. South fifty Degrees East one hundred and twelve Perches to a marked white oak. North forty Degrees East Eleven Perches and three quarters of a Perch to a post. South fifty five Degrees East Seventy eight perches to a marked white oak, and South sixty Degrees West three hundred and twenty eight perches to a forked Ash tree marked standing on the said Schuylkill River thence up the same on the several Courses thereof to the place of Beginning Containing Four hundred and ^{sixty} one Acres and an half and the usual allowance of six Acres & Cent for Roads &c^e Returned into the Secretarys Office the 11th Day of December Anno Dom. 1754.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this tenth day of May 1910.
