



William Penn Proprietary & Govern<sup>r</sup> of ye Province of Penn-  
sylvania, & ye Territories thereunto belonging.

At ye Request of Robert Turner, y<sup>t</sup> I would grant him to take up One  
hundred & four foot of Land in & before ye bank of ye River Delaware  
containing in front ye breath of his own Lott & two foot down ward  
to Joseph Fishers Lott. Containing upon ye bank of ye first street  
upon ye s<sup>d</sup> Bank sixty foot distan (obl.) from ye front of his own  
Lott, running out in length into ye River Two h (obl.) ed & fifty foot  
& no farther, he making a Wharf & building acco (obl.) to Regulation:  
These are to will and require thee forthw<sup>th</sup> to survey or cause to  
be survey'd unto him ye s<sup>d</sup> Number of feet, & make Returns there-  
of into my Secretary's Office. Given at Philadelphia, ye 4<sup>th</sup> of ye  
6<sup>th</sup> M<sup>o</sup> 1684.
