Chester ye 6<sup>th</sup> of 10<sup>br</sup> 1743.

Inclosed is ye Draughts of ye Lands of John Scott, Tho<sup>s</sup> Hope, John McFarson & George Wilkins. I have Sent also a Draught of ye Land surd to Evan Price on Schuylkill &c. A ford may be made Good and Convenient at some Charge. I suppose about 30<sup>l</sup> might do ye Work, James Taylor a Neighbour Guesseth 40<sup>l</sup> might Effect it. But Francis Parvin Says it may take 100<sup>l</sup>. The place is Convenient to Build on both Side of ye River and ye making a Road will be no more Charge ye Cutting some Wood Except at ye sd ford, and will be almost as near to Philadelphia as ye Present Road from Tulpehoccon.
