Whereas several Persons have without the least Colour of Right seated themselves on Lands within ^{our} ~~the Honourable the Proprietaries~~ Manor of Ruscomb in the County of Berks: who now request that the Lands they have settled on may be granted to them on certain Conditions to be made by ^{us} ~~the said Proprietaries~~. but as the true Nature of such Lands cannot be known before they are Surveyed and layed out You are therefore hereby directed to Survey and lay out to each of the Persons above mentioned, such a Quantity of Land as shall be convenient for a Settlement taking Care that it be laid out so as not to injure or render the Adjacent Lands useless, and make Return ^{into the Secretarys Office.} ~~of~~ of what you do in Pursuance of this ~~Order~~ Warrant. Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Land Office at Philadelphia this 14th Day of September 1756.
