

By Vertue of a Warrant under the hands of the Commissioners of Property and the seal of the Province bearing date the first day of the 2^d. month 1702.

Survey'd and laid out unto Martha Durant alias Joice Relict of Jn^o. Durant deceased a Certain Tract of land^{ye} in County of Chester, beginning at a stake in the Welch line being a line dividing This from David Howels land from thence by a line of trees North thirty nine degrees and three quarters westerly two hundred Sixty five perches. Then East (obl.) north two hundred fifty five perches to a stake set in the Ground near a white oak marked for a Corner. from thence by a line of marked trees south east two hundred eighty four ^{Perches} ~~to~~ to a Post set in the ground near an old stump of a burnt tree in the afores^d Welch line, from thence in the said line west by South two hundred and ninety perches to the place of Beginning. Containing four hund^d and two acres. Survey'd by David Powel ~~and~~ and Returned into the General Surveyors Office the 12th day of the 11th month 1702.
