Whereas in pursuance of the first Regulation for laying out Lands in this Province as well to the Proprietor himself as the People, Thou was Ordered and Required in the Year 1703 to survey and lay out to the said Proprietor William Penn Esq. fifteen thousand Acres of Land in the County of Bucks in the place commonly call'd the great Swamp which was by thee Survey'd and laid out accordingly. Now these are to require thee to make a true and Compleat Return of this said Survey into the Surveyors General's Office of this Province there to Remain & to be and continue of Record and from thence to be Returned into the Secretaries Office. And this Warrt thou art required to executed by a Copy thereof certified by the Secretary. Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> the 26<sup>th</sup> day of the Second Month 1707.
