

The Governor taking into Consideration a survey made for the Prop<sup>se</sup> use of a Tract of 210 A<sup>s</sup> 3/4 of vacant land lying between the plantations of James Davies John Maxwell David Jones & Francis Allison & the Welch line dividing Tredyfrin from Charlestown Townships Chester County. It is agreed with the said James Davies John Maxwell David Jones & Francis Allison that they have the parts of the said vacancy opposite their lands at 50<sup>l</sup> & 100 A<sup>s</sup>. & 4<sup>o</sup> 2<sup>d</sup> Sterling and that the Surveyor General order their several parts of the said vacancy to be laid out by continuing their respective lines up to the said Welch line. And make return of their several & respective parts in-order for confirmation.

The above is a true copy of a Minute of a Meeting of the Board of Property the 26<sup>th</sup> May 1766 at which were present His Honour the Governor.
