The bearer hereof James Galbreath Brought me a letter from Baptist Clark Desiring yt ye <sup>draught might be</sup> above mention'd returned and two others viz John Makorn (or making in ye warr<sup>ts</sup>) and John or Andrew Leycon in r<sup>t</sup> of him M<sup>o</sup> Currys. The first of these was return'd ye second of June last. The last named of these was return'd in March last and contains 25<sup>ac</sup> of which my kinsman Tho<sup>s</sup> Lightfoot<sup>r</sup> hath a Bile of sale from<sup>d</sup> Baptist Clark who erected a Grist mill thereon. I expect yt there is no intention of Fraud but only mention this yt Tho<sup>s</sup> Lightfoot may be apprize<sup>d</sup> of ye Contents if occasion require it.
