Whereas there was formerly surveyd and laid out by my ord^r to my
daughter Letitia Penna a certain lott of ground in the town of Philadelphia
containing one hundred feet in breadth on the front of the river Dela-
ware and one hundred feet on ye second street extending between the
said Streets 396 feet along the southermost side of the High street of
the said town. And whereas there is adjoining to the sd lott a piece of
vacant grant reputed to be 70 feet in breadth on ye sd Front street bound-
ed by the lott of the Widow Jennet southward: These are to require thee
forthwith to resurvey and lay out or cause to be resurveyd and laid out
to my said daughter the said lott, together with the sd vacant piece of
ground bounded as afores^d and make an exact return thereof into
my Secretaries office with all expedition. Given under my hand and seal
at Philad^{ia} the 10th day of the 11th month 1700.
