Whereas James Agnew and Thomas Douglass of the County of Cumberland ^{ex} have humbly requested us to grant unto them five acres of land within our Manor of Maske in the said County for a Meeting House of Religious Worship in trust for divers of the Inhabitants of the said Manor of the Presbyterian Persuasion & for a Burial yard & parsonage house, And we favouring the said request, And willing to promote the good purpose a^d have condescended & agreed to grant the same under the yearly Quitrent of one shilling Sterling forever These are therefore to require you to survey or cause to be surveyed the said five acres of land in the Forks of Plum Run in the said Manor joining the Improvements thereof James Wilson & Andrew Thomson And make return thereof into our Secretaries Office in order for Confirmation by Patent to the said James Agnew & Thomas Douglass & their Heirs in trust for the purposes & Uses a^d and for your so doing this shall be your sufficient warrant. Given under my hand & the seal of the Land Office by virtue of Certain powers from the said proprietaries at Philad^a this seventeenth day of April One thousand seven hundred & sixty-five.
