Guardians of the Heirs of Thomas Boyd dec'd have  
 Whereas Robert McPherson & Samuel Edie, of the County of York, ~~have~~ re-  
 quested that we would grant them our warrant for One hundred & fifty acres of  
 land, joining Lands of Samuel Gettys David Moore Thomas Nelson & others  
 in trust for the said Heirs) in Cumberland Township, York County, being part  
 of the Thirty Thousand acres of land which by our warrant of the Eight-  
 eenth Day of June, One Thousand seven hundred and forty-one, we directed  
 our then Surveyor General to survey on the Branches of Marsh-Creek, on  
 the West Side of the River Sasquehanna, then in the County of Lancaster,  
 now York, for our own proper Use, and the same to return under the Name  
 and style of our Manor of Maske; and it now appearing to us, that the  
 said One hundred & fifty acres of land was settled before the issuing  
 our said Warrant for the said Manor, we have notwithstanding conde-  
 scended and agreed to grant the same to the said Robert McPherson  
 & Samuel Edie in trust as afd. on the then common Terms, the Interest  
 and Quitrent to commence from the First day of March, One Thousand  
 seven Hundred and forty-one being the Time of Settlement, and for which  
 he agrees to pay to our Use, within the Term of six months from the  
 date hereof, at the rate of Fifteen Pounds Ten shillings, current Money of  
 this Province, for every Hundred acres; and also to pay the yearly Quitrent  
 of One Halfpenny Sterling for every Acre thereof, to us, our Heirs and Assigns  
 forever: These are therefore to authorise and require you to survey, or cause  
 to be surveyed unto the said Robert McPherson & Samuel Edie, <sup>in trust, as afd.</sup> at the Place  
 aforesaid, according to the Method of Townships appointed, the said Quantity  
 of One hundred & fifty Acres, and make return thereof into the Secret-  
 ary's Office, in order for Confirmation; for which this shall be your suff-  
 icient warrant: Which warrant and survey, in case the said Robert  
 McPherson & Sam<sup>l</sup> Edie fulfil the above agreement within six Months  
 from the Date hereof, shall be valid, otherwise void. Given under my Hand,

and the Seal of the Land-Office, by virtue of certain Powers from the said  
 Proprietaries, at Philadelphia, this sixteenth day of January Anno Domini  
 One Thousand seven Hundred and sixty seven.
