



Where the Commissioners of Property by their Warrant under their Hands and the lesser Seal of the Province bearing date the 5th day of the Third Month An^o 1719 Did Authorise & require me to survey or cause to be surveyd unto Humphrey Murry and John Budd the proportion of Liberty Land Appurtenant & belonging to five Thousand acres. The Original Purchase made of the late Proprietary William Penn Esq^r by William Bacon of the Middle Temple Gent^l by deeds of Lease & Release dated the 11th & 12th dayes of 8th Anno 1681 who by other like Deeds dated the 19th & 20th dayes of February An^o 1718 granted the whole unto the sd Humphrey Murry & John Budd who again by their Deed duly executed bearing date the—Granted & Conveyd the sd Proportion of Liberty Land unto James Logan of the City of Philadelphia Merchant. Now These may certify that in pursuance of the Warrant to me Directed as afores^d I have surveyd and Laid out unto the said James Logan within the Liberties of Philad^a a certain tract of land Beginning at an Old marked black Oak at a corner of a Tract or parcel of land laid out in right of John Barber From thence by the line of the same Land N.S.W 113 perches to a corner Then N.N.W by Land laid out to Andrew Robeson and other land of the said James Logan 116 perches to a marked white Oak at a corner of Joseph Shippers Land Then E.N.E by the land laid out to John Shippers and Jacob Telner 118 perches Then S.S.E by the land laid out to Hans Neuyse 56 perches to another white Oak marked for a corner. Then S.S.E Oak marked for a corner. Then N.S.W 5 perches to the place of Beginning. Containing and laid out for eighty acres by the land of Hans Neuyse 56 perches to the place of Beginning. Containing and laid out for eighty acres this 20th day of May An^o 1719 and returned into the Secretary's Office the 1st day of June in the year aforesaid
