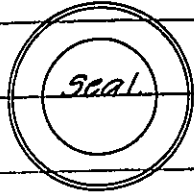


Pennsylvania ss

These are to authorize and require the to survey or cause to be surveyed unto Andrew Hamilton of the City of Philadelphia Esq^r a certain piece of land to us belonging supposed to contain about ten acres lying near ye Town of NewCastle bounded on the north with the road leading from the said town to the lower parts of the County on the east with a Lane or passage from the said Town to the Marsh at the lower End thereof on the South with a piece of Ground called Brick Yard and on the West with the Swamp or Cripple of David French and make return thereof into our Secretaries Office in order for Confirmation and for which this shall be thy sufficient Warrant Given under my hand and the lesser Seal of the said Province at Philadelphia this 28th day of Novemb^r Anno Dom 1735.
