By virtue of a warrant from the Proprietaries to me directed bearing date the 2^d day of the 6th month (August) 1734 I have surveyed on the 19th day of 9^{ber} Anno Dom 1734 To Clement Plumstead of the City of Philadelphia Merchant, A small Tract of land lying within the ^{sd} Proprietaries Mann^r of Springetsbury Beginning at a Corner post of ye Land of the said Clement Plumstead and extending thence by the Land called Bush Hill belonging to Andrew Hamilton Esq^r north seventy four degrees West one hundred sixteen perches & a half to a small black Oak, thence by the other part of the said Mann^r North sixteen degrees East twenty nine perches & eleven feet to the South side of a Road leading from the river Schuylkil thro' the said Mann^r to Wisschickon High Road, thence by the first mentioned road south eighty degrees & a half east one hundred & seventeen perches to a corner of the said Clement Plumstead's land, thence by the same south sixteen degrees west forty two perches & a quarter of a perch to the place of Beginning containing twenty six acres & twenty eight perches. Returned into the Secretary's office the 22^d day of 9^{ber} 1734.
