At the Request of William Hudson of Philadelphia that We would Grant him a piece of Vacant Ground Situate among his Lots on the North side of the High Street of Philadelphia aforesaid being in breadth about Seven and Twenty foot and the same length with the adjacent ^{Lots} for which he agrees to pay to the Propriet^{use} fifteen pounds Money of Pennsylvania and the Yearly Quitrent of one Shilling Sterling from the Year 1684 Inclusive These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Surveyd and laid out unto the Said William Hudson in the place aforesaid the Said piece of Vacant Ground and make exact Returns of the Same into the Secretarys Office in Order for a further Confirmation Given under our Hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 10th day of y^e 2^d Month A D 1718
