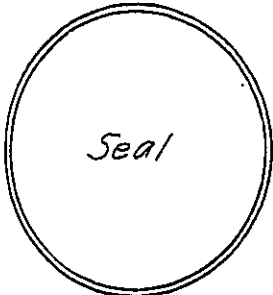

*William Penn Absolute Proprietary & Govern^r in Chief
of the Province of Pennsylvania and Counties Annexed*

*At the Request of Robert Heath That I would grant him to take up five hundred
Acres of Land, in right of Thomas Woolrich Old Purchaser of one Thousand Acres These
are to require thee forthwith to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto him the said Number
of five hundred Acres of Land in this Province where it is not already survey'd, taken
up, Concealed nor Seated by the Indians, to be laid out according to the Method of
Townships by me Appointed He Seating and Improving the same within twelve Months
after the Date of Survey and make returns thereof into my Secretaries Office. Given
under my hand and Seal at Philadelphia the 14th day of 9th Moth 1700*

of the Province of Pennsylvania & Territories*
