


By Virtue of a Warrant from the Commissioners of Prop^{ty} bearing Date the 22^d day of the 10th Month 1714 — Surveyd and Laid out unto William Hartner on the 4th Day of January 171 $\frac{1}{2}$ a Tract or Parcel of Land in the Manor of Springfield in the County of Philadelphia Beginning at a small White Oak sapling in the Line of the German Township and at a Corner of another Tract of the said Hartners Land Thence by the said German town Line North West thirty one Pches to post at a Corner of J^r Shire's Land Then by the same North East Ninety five Pches to a Post Then North West by the said Shire's Land Seventy two Pches then by the Manor Land on the same Course forty six Pches to a Corner Marked Black Oak Sappling Thence North East by the Manor two hundred and twenty Pches to a Post Then South East fourteen Pches to a Corner Post Then South West One hundred forty one Pches Then South East Sixty Nine Pches Then North East fifty three Pches Then South East Seventy One Pches Then South West two hundred ~~two hundred~~ twenty seven Pches to the place of Beginning ~~Containing One hundred twenty seven Acres~~ (The five Courses the Lines Last Mentioned running by other Lands of the said William Hartner) Containing One hundred twenty seven Acres
