*By the Govern^r & Commiss^{rs} of Pennsylvania for setting out
Lands to the purchasers and planters in the said province.*

*Whereas severall persons are already arrived this province, in order to plant and
in habit here, & others coming after, who are to have fifty acres apeece layd out to
them, for their head rights, and are or may be unable to stay, untill all the
purchasers be first satisfied, & so them selves and families be exposed to perjury
and ruine. For prevention whereof, we have thought necessary, and do hereby
order and desire the Survey^r Gen^l of this province, to consider and fittle out a
tract of Land where he shall think fitt for such a purpose, and to lay out to such
persons as are or shall come over on the said account of headrights, and are
poor & have their dependance only on the same, the respective quantities due
them for their headrights. Dated at Upland this 13th 7^{mo} 1682*
