Taylor's Purchase and the Remainder claimed by Thomas Fairman in Right of a Warrant for 300<sup>a</sup> Granted to him from the said Proprietary

Resurveyd the said Tract beginning at a black oak at a Corner of Joseph Matter's Land, Thence North west two hundred forty two perches to a post at a Corner of James Williams and Company's Land Then by the same south west five hundred and twenty six perches to a post Then south East two hundred and thirty six perches to a post at another Corner of the said Joseph Matter's Land <sup>then down</sup> the same North east five hundred and twenty Six perches to the place of Beginning Containing seven hundred & seventy nine acres


