



In Pursuance of a Warrant dated the 6<sup>th</sup> day of January 1770 I did on the 23<sup>d</sup> day of the same month Survey & Lay out for Robert Smith of the City of Philad<sup>a</sup> House Carpenter the above described Lot of Ground situate in the district of Southwark Containing in breadth on Second Street [ Enlarged by 4 feet being aded to the westside thereof ] Eighteen feet and on George Street thirty three feet & in Length on Cedar Street 256 feet Bounded Eastward by Second street Enlarged as afores<sup>d</sup> Northward by Cedar Street Westward by George Street & Southward by Rob<sup>t</sup> Smiths other Ground.
