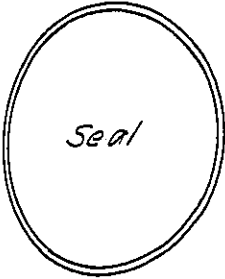


Pennsylvania 55



George the third, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, France, and Ireland, King,
 Defender of the Faith, &c. To JOHN LUKERS of the City of Philadelphia Esquire Greeting
 We command you that, laying aside all Business and Excuses whatsoever you be and
 appear in your proper person before our Justices of our Supreme Court of the Province
 of Pennsylvania at a Supreme Court to be held at Philadelphia for the said Province
 the seventeenth day of October instant to testify all and singular those things which
 you shall know in a certain plea of Trespass and Ejectment wherein Timothy Peaceable,
 Lessee of JOHN BARON, is Plaintiff, and JOHN Inglis is Defendant, then and there
 to be tried by a Jury of the Country; and that you bring with you a Warrant to Joseph
 Turner for Lots and Liberty Lands numbered ninety two William Brigdale N.S. a
 Warrant to Hannah Musgrove for twenty Acres of Liberty Land, numbered ^{hundred six} fifteen, Jm^o
 Hughes N.S. Book B in your Office containing the Return of the Society's Lots - Paper
 entitled William Allet's City Lots in Right of Lowther's Purchase, N^o eighty eight,
 William Brigdale N.S. - a Warrant for Philip Ford's City Lots, N^o eight hundred seventy
 one, Jm^o Hughes N.S. - and Book D containing a Draught of part of Moyamensing and
 Wicocoo Lands &c. And herein fail not, under penalty of one hundred pounds,
 Witness William Allet Esquire, Chief Justice of our said Province, at Philadelphia,
 the sixteenth day of October, in the twelfth year of our Reign. Annoque Domini
 MDCCLXXIX.
