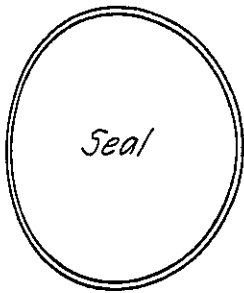

*At the Request of Rowland Ellis junr That We would Grant him to take up the Quantity of five Hundred Acres of Land in this Province in part of three Thousand Acres purchased of the late Proprietor by Daniel Wharley late of London Decd. by Deeds of Lease & Release dated the 3<sup>d</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> dayes of April anno 1695 whose Eldest Son and Heir Daniel Wharley by Indentures of Lease and Release dated the 2<sup>d</sup> & 3<sup>d</sup> dayes of April anno 1724 Granted and Released the whole unto the said Rowland Ellis his Heirs & Assignes forever These are to Authorize and and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Surveyd in Right of the Original purchase aforesaid according to the Method of Townships appointed in the said Province the said quantity of five Hundred acres of Land that has not been already Surveyd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office in Order for a further Confirmation Given under our Hands & the lesser Seal of the Province the 21<sup>st</sup> day of the Third Month anno Dni 1725*
