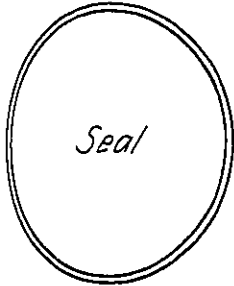


Pennsylvania 55

At the Request of Rowland Ellis <sup>Junr</sup> that We would Grant him to take up <sup>of</sup> quantity of three Hundred acres of Land in this Province in part of three Thousand Acres purchased of the late Proprietor by Daniel Wharley late of London Decd. by Deeds of Lease & Release dated the 3<sup>d</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> dayes of April anno 1695 whose Eldest Son and Heir Daniel Wharley by Indentures of Lease & Release dated the 2<sup>d</sup> & 3<sup>d</sup> dayes of April anno 1724 Granted and Released the whole unto <sup>of</sup> said Rowland Ellis his Heirs & assignes forever These are to Authorize & Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd ~~unto~~ in Right of the Original purchase aforesaid according to the Method of Townships appointed in the said Province the said quantity of three Hundred Acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office in Order for a further Confirmation Given under our Hands & the lesser Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>a</sup> the 21<sup>st</sup> day of <sup>of</sup> third Month anno D<sup>omi</sup>ni 1725
