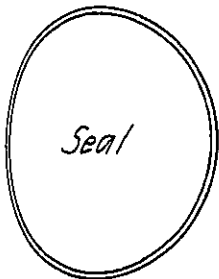


Pennsylvania ss

Whereas the Proprietor by his Deeds of Lease & Release in y^e Year 1681 Granted unto Edw^d. Erberry of the City of Bristol five hundred Acres of Land in this Province w^{ch} doe not appear to us to have ever been taken up & possessed by him or his Assigns & therefore his Daughters & Coheirs Elizab: Jones. Mary Leach & Ann Erberry all of Bristol by their Attorney Rob^t. Packer requesting a Grant & Survey thereof These are to Authorize & Require thee to Survey or cause to be survey'd to the s^d Elizabeth Mary & Anne the s^d quantity of five hundred acres of Land (according to the Method of Townships appointed) that has not been already Survey'd nor taken up nor is concealed nor is Seated by the Indians. and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office The said Land to be held by them in case it shall not appear that y^e s^d Edw^d or his Assigns has already had his right according to the s^d Purchase otherwise this Grant to be Void. Given under our hands & the Seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the 6th day of Sept^{ber} 1709
