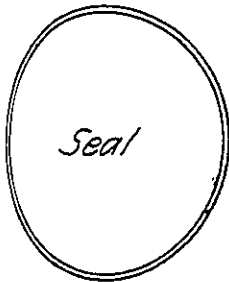

At the Request of James Logan that We would Grant him to take up Two thousand five hundred Acres of Land Originally purchased of the Proprietor by Hugh Lamb of St Martins in the ffields in the County of Middlesex Hoser by Deeds dated the 14<sup>th</sup> & 15<sup>th</sup> dayes of Septemb<sup>r</sup> in y<sup>e</sup> Year 1681 and since Convey'd to the said James by Joseph Lamb brother & Heir (as appears) to the s<sup>d</sup> Hugh Lamb deceased: These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd to the said James Logan in the right afores<sup>d</sup> according to the Method of Townships appointed ~~the~~ deducting the Proportion of Liberty Land due to the said Purchase the said quantity of Two thousand five hundred Acres of Land in one or more Tracts in this Province that has not been already Survey'd nor taken up by others nor is Seated by the Indians, and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>a</sup> the 25<sup>th</sup> day of y<sup>e</sup> 4<sup>th</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> 1712.
