Upon the Application of James Logan of Stenton in the County of Philadelphia Esq^r. that We would be pleased to Grant him a Survey on two hundred Acres of Land on the North line within our ~~Manner~~ ^{Manner} of Conestogo whereon James Paterson has for some years past made ~~Some~~ Improvement and Still dwells on the Same, which said two hundred Acres are to be part of Seven hundred ^{Acres} already Granted by our Warrant to be Surveyed within our said Manner unto the said James Logan These are to Authorize and Require thee forthwith to Survey or cause to be Surveyed unto the said James Logan on the North line of our said Manner beginning at the lower end of y^e Plantation ~~from~~ ^{next to} the River Sassquahannock and including the said Settlement & Plantation by regular lines, with as little Damage to our said Manner as may be, the said ~~quantity~~ two hundred Acres of Land and make Returne thereof into our Secretaries Office in Order for Confirmation, and for which this Shall be thy Sufficient Warrant Given under my hand and the lesser Seal of our Province at Philadelphia the 23^d day of the Sixth Month (August) Anno Dni 1734
