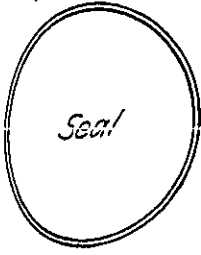


Pennsylvania ss



By the Commissioners of Property.

Whereas Renier Tyser Leonard Streijers & Griffith Jones all of this Province Agents to the Heirs of John Streijers late of Grefeld in Germany an Original Purchaser of five Thousand Acres of Land in this Province Have by their Petition represented unto us That a Tract of four Thousand four hundred & forty eight Acres was in the year 1703 laid out in the County of Bucks and Confirmed by Patent Anno 1705 unto the said John Streijers in Right of his said purchase and that in pursuance of Orders they received from the said John Streijers & his Heirs to Sell the said Land they have for many Years used their best Endeavours to dispose of the Same Accordingly but that they find it impracticable, for that not only the Indians lay a Claim to the Tract where now Situated but that the said John Streijers dying an Alien they cannot procure a good Title to the said Land and now can find no other Method to have Justice done to the said Streijers's Heirs than by resigning all the said Tract to the Proprietary and receiving the like quantity in some other place to be Confirmed by the Prop^{rs} or us to the person or persons purchasing the said Right, and Whereas James Logan of this City on these Measures and on the same View has purchased of the Heirs of the said John Streijers in Germany all the said 4448 Acres of Land as by their Deeds to him ^{now} produced appears and doth now fully and absolutely Release to the said Prop^{rs} all the said 4448 Acres of Land as Located by the said Survey and Confirmed by the said Patent in Consideration of the same quantity ~~to be~~ ^{to be} granted to him & Company more remote in the said County but so Situate as that it may better Accommodate certain Iron works wherein he is concerned for which he has also obtained the Consent & Approbation of the late Prop^{rs} Heirs or Descendants and therefore prays our Warrant for laying out to him the said quantity. These therefore are to Authorize & Require thee to Survey or cause to be Surveyed to the said James Logan the said Quantity of four Thousand four hundred & forty eight Acres of Land in y^e new Township of Durham in the said County of Bucks lately Settled by the said James Logan & Company Contiguous to the other Tracts there Surveyed for their Iron works. To hold to the said James Logan his Heirs & Assignes forever, and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office Given under our hands and the lesser Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 15th day of y^e Third Moth (May) Anno Dⁿⁱ 1727.
