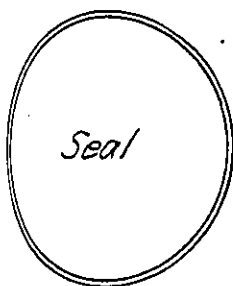

At the Request of James Logart That we would Grant him to take up ~~Eighty~~ Seventy Acres of Land remaining untaken up of two hundred and fifty Acres of Original Purchase of Edw<sup>d</sup> Edwards of the County of Wilts with the whole Right to which Purchase y<sup>s</sup> James appears to be now invested As also that we would grant him to take ~~up~~ up the Proportion of Liberty Land and City Lot<sup>t</sup> appurtenant to the s<sup>d</sup> Purchase These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be survey'd to the s<sup>d</sup> James Logart adjoining to his other Land granted to be taken up the s<sup>d</sup> quantity of ~~eighty~~ Seventy Acres of Land with his Proportion of Liberty Land and Town Lot<sup>t</sup> appurtenant to y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Purchase where Vacant and not conceal'd, and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office. Given under our hands & Seal of the s<sup>d</sup> Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> the fourteenth day of October Anno Domi. 1708
