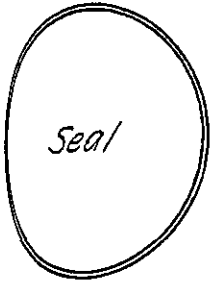

Whereas in pursuance of a Warrant from the Late Commiss^{rs} of Property Under Our Lesser Seal bearing date the twenty fifth day of the Month of March 1720 there was Surveyed to Josiah Devenport of the County of Lancaster a Tract of Two hundred Acres of Land Lying on the East side of Sasquahanna River in the said County which Tract of Land the said Josiah Devenport hath since Bargained and Sold unto James Logan of Stenton Gent^l Who having purchased an Original Grant of Two thousand Acres of Land made by Our Late Father William Penn Esq^r unto William Lloyd and Abraham Lloyd of the City of Bristol in Great Britain in Right whereof a Survey hath been made but not duly returned on Two hundred Acres ^{lying} contiguous to the Tract above mentioned These are therefore at the Request of the said James Logan to Authorize & Require thee to accept the said Survey and make Return thereof together with the first mentioned two hundred Acres as they lye contiguous in One Tract into Our Secretarys Office in order for Confirmation and for which this shall be thy Sufficient Warrant Given under Our Hands and the Lesser Seal of Our Province at Philadelphia the ^{dated} 25th day of March Ann^o Dom^o 1735
