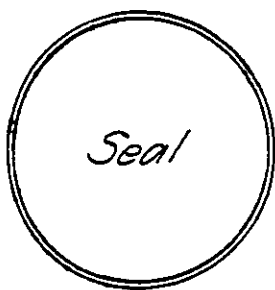


Pennsylvania ss

At the Request of James Logan of Sternton, <sup>Esq.</sup> that Wee would Grant him a Returne of Two Hundred and Six Acres of Land already Survey'd to him in a Tract of Six Hundred Acres Situate on a branch of Pecqua Creek in the County of Lancaster, Three Hundred Ninety four Acres whereof were <sup>Israel Pemberton in Trust for</sup> Confirmed to him by Patent from the late Commission<sup>rs</sup> of Property in Right of the Original Grants made by Our Deceased Father to John Geary and Henry Geary and the Two Hundred and Six Acres now requested are to be in part of Two Thousand Acres Granted by Our said Deceased Father to William Lloyd and Abraham Lloyd the Right whereof being now Vested in the said James Logan These are to Authorize and Require thee forthwith to make Returne of the said Two Hundred and Six Acres together with the Three Hundred Ninety four Acres according to the Survey thereof already made into the Secretarys Office in order for a further Confirmation of the same unto the said James Logan for which this shall be thy Sufficient Warrant Given under my Hand and the Lesser Seal at Philadelphia the 13<sup>th</sup> day of Decem. Anno Dom. 1733
