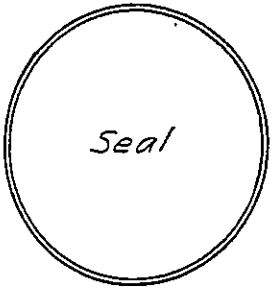

At the Request of Philip Howel That we would grant him to take up Sundry Rights of headland belonging to Servants who came in at the first Settling of this Province purchased by him of the sd Serv^{ts} to witt fifty Acres in right of Humphry Edwards who came servant to John^{ap} Edwards One hundred Acres in right of Jeremiah Osborn and his Wife Servants to Griff^{ap} Jones fifty Acres in right of Jacob Willis Serv^t to Will^m Cloud, fifty Acres in right of Evan Williams Servant to Tho: Ellis and the same quantity in right of his Wife Elizabeth serv^t to John Bevan being in the whole three hundred Acres at a half penny Sterl⁻ p⁻ Acre These are to Authorize and require thee to survey and lay out to the said Philip Howel according to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of three hundred Acres of Land in this Province not already Survey^d nor taken up nor conceal'd nor Seated by y^e Indians & make Returns into the Gen^l Surveyors Office at Philad^{ia} where this Warr^t is to remain & a Copy thereof to be deliv^d to thee certified by the Secy Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} 20th 9th 1703
