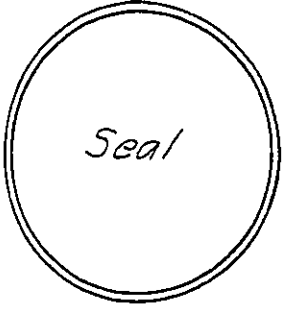

 Acres who came all Servants to the Society of Traders being in all three hundred Acres
 under the Yearly quitrent of one half penny Sterl^r p^r Acre These are to Authorize and
 Require thee to Survey to the said Philip Howel according to the method of Townships
 appointed the said quantity of three hundred Acres of Land in this Province not already
 Survey'd nor taken up nor is conceal'd nor Seated by the Indians and make Returns
 into the Genl^l Surveyors Office where this Warr^t is to remain & a Copy thereof to be deliv'd
 to thee certified by the Secretary. Given under our hands & y^e Seal of the Province
 at Philad^{ia} 20th 10th Moth 1703.
