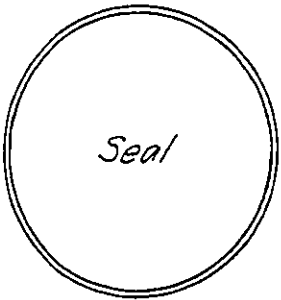


Pennsylvania ss



By the Commissioners of Property

At the Request of John Harben late of Germany but now of this Province that we would Grant him to take up Two Hundred Acres of Land at Oley for which he agrees to pay to the use of the Trustees of this Province Thirty pounds Money thereof for the whole and the Yearly Quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for each Hundred Acres These are to Authorize & Require thee to Survey or cause to be Surveyed unto the said Jonathan Harben in the place aforesaid according to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of Two Hundred Acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office which Survey in case the said Jonathan Pay down one Moiety of the said Thirty pounds and the other Moiety within Six Months after the date hereof shall be Valid otherwise the same is to be Void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted Given under our Hands and the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 25th day of the first Month Anno Domini 1720.
