These are to authorize and require thee forthwith to survey and lay out to the s<sup>d</sup> Philip Roman the s<sup>d</sup> number of One hundred and seventy acres of land in this Province not already Survey'd nor taken up nor concealed nor seated by the Indians and make returns into the General Surveyor's Office at Philadelphia where this warr<sup>t</sup> is to remain and a copy thereof to be delv'd to thee certified by the Secretary. Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> the 30<sup>th</sup> 4<sup>mo</sup> 1702.
