

By the Commissioners of Property.

*Upon an agreement this day made with John Roelof
 Pennsylvania ss. Vander Werf of the County of Philadelphia for three hun-
 dred acres of land seitate on the branches Shepack in
 the said County sold to him by Thomas ffairman in his life
 time but his execut^{rs} not being able to make him a Title for
 the same He the said John agrees to pay to the proprietors
 use sixty two pounds fifteen shillings (besides what he paid ^{to} Thomas
ffairman in his life time) for the said three hundred acres and the yearly quit-
 rent of one shilling sterling for every hundred thereof. These are to author-
 ize and require thee to Survey or cause to be surveyed unto the said
 John Roelof in the place aforesaid the said tract or parcell of Land to contain
 three hundred acres having a regard to the remaining vacancy that it be left
 with as much advantage to the propriet^{rs} as the Tract will aford and make a true
 return thereof into the Secretary's Office which survey in case the said John Roelof
 pay down to the Prop^{rs} use upon this survey now to be made thirty-two Pounds and
 the remainder of this agreement within six months after the date hereof shall be
 valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this war-
