



In pursuance of a warrant granted to John Simpson of London dated the 31<sup>st</sup> day of the 10<sup>mo</sup> 1733 for the takeing up the Liberty land appurtenant to the original purchase of 10,000 acres in this Province made by William, Margaret, John, & Ann Charlott Lowthers, There was resurveyed on the 15<sup>th</sup> of April 1776 (it haveing been survey'd for the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Proprietaries in the year 1736 by Benj<sup>d</sup> Eastburn Survey<sup>r</sup> Gen<sup>l</sup>) the above described twelve acres of land situate in Blockley Township on the West side of the River Schuylkill, for William Allen Esquire, who purchased of said John Simpson & Inform'd me he had agreed to convey the same to William Hamilton Esq<sup>r</sup>
