By the Commissioners of Property.

At the request of George Robinson of Newark in the County of Newcastle that we would grant him to take up two hundred and fifty acres of land in this Province being the remainder untaken up of Jn^o Toovey's original Purchase of twelve hundred and fifty acres convey'd by the s^d Toovey to Abiah Taylor who granted the s^d quantity of two hundred & fifty acres to Rich^d Lewin of whom the s^d George derives a right to the same. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd to the s^d George Robinson according to the method of Townships appointed the s^d number of two hundred and fifty acres of land in this Province that has not been already Survey'd nor taken up nor is concealed nor is seated by the Indians & make returns thereof into the Secretaries Office. Given under our hands & seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the 15th day of the 6th moth 1707.
