These are to will and require thee forthwth to survey or cause to be
survey'd unto him y^e said number of Acres in a place not
already taken up according to y^e method of Townships appointed
by me and make returns thereof into my Secretary's Office.

Given at Philadelphia the 19th of y^e 1st mo 1683.
