



The 17<sup>th</sup> of ye first mo<sup>th</sup> 1684.

By virtue of a warrant bearing date the 11<sup>th</sup> day of the first moneth 1684. Surveyed and layed out unto Peeter Rambo by a resurvey a certaine parcell of land Called Rambo's Dorp Scituate one the East side of <sup>Dublin (formerly called</sup> Pemapecka) Creeke beginning att a stake standing by a peice of meadow close by the maine River bearing S.E. b S. 10 perches from a black oke stump marked for a corner thence downe by y<sup>e</sup> said River to the mouth of Pemapecka Creeke and up the Creeke the severall courses to a small spanish oke saplyn by y<sup>e</sup> creeke side marke for a corner thence N.E. b E. to a small w<sup>t</sup> oke for another corner thence S.E. b S. 344 perches to the first mentioes stake by Delaware River Containing three hundred and ten acres of land.
