*William Penn Proprietary and Govern^r of the Province
of Pensilvania and Counties annexed.*

*Whereas by the first Concessions and regulations for
locating lands in this Province It was agreed and concluded that
the tenth part of all lands in the s^d Province should be survey'd and
reserved to me for my proper use w^{ch} has not hitherto been duly ob-
served and whereas there are several Tracts of vacant or concealed
Lands Interjacent among the p^{sent} Settlem^{ts} and survey'd Lands not
yet taken up nor appropriated: These therefore are to require thee
forthwith to survey or cause to be survey'd for my use as afore s^d as
much and so many of the afore s^d Tracts and Parcels of vacant and
concealed Lands in the said Province as shall compleat the full quan-
tity of thirty thousand Acres, if so much there may be found and
make Returns thereof ^{severally} into the Surveyor Gen^{ls} Office from thence to
be returned severally into my Secretaries Office. Given under my hand &
seal at Philadelphia the 23^d day of the 8th Month 1701.*
